#### Theme for JSTS 2023

### Designing the Future of Humankind and our Coexistence with Nature

Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are goals for the international community as whole, adopted at a UN Summit in September 2015. The global objective we all share is to realize a sustainable society that leaves no one behind. International goals have been established in 17 fields—including poverty, education, energy, climate change, and industry—to be achieved by 2030.

The purpose of JSTS 2023 is for participants to acquire capabilities needed as global leaders for leading Society 5.0. More specifically, the aim is to improve the following capabilities and skills:

1) The ability to lead a problem-solving effort by a team

- 2) The ability to create new value by combining interactive AI (ChatGPT etc.) knowledge and technology
- 3) The ability to understand things in a multifaceted way, and to bring latent social problems to

the surface

4) The mindset and ability to be active globally

#### What is JSTS?

The Japan Seminar on Technology for Sustainability (JSTS) is a seminar primarily for students. It concerns science and technology, and is organized by the National Institute of Technology ("the institute") for colleges of technology, universities of science and technology, and overseas universities. It has been held in Japan since the 2016 academic year with the aim not only of imparting knowledge through workshops based on the 17 SDGs, but also—through various cultural and language exchange activities—of improving global communication abilities essential for today's globalized era and facilitation abilities for collaboration in diverse groups.\*

Originally, JSTS was first held in academic year 2016 (AY2016) prior to the International Seminar on Technology for Sustainability (ISTS)—an event which has been held overseas since academic year 2011 by the institute and overseas institutions with comprehensive agreements for academic exchange. The objectives of JSTS were things like improving the facilitation abilities of the students who play the central role in the ISTS. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, ISTS was canceled from academic year 2020 (AY2020), and thus since AY2021, ISTS has been held in the format of inviting students from overseas to JSTS.

This seminar is planned and operated\* primarily by students through the Japanese Student Organizing Committee (JSOC), which is composed mainly of college of technology students. This helps to strengthen the English communication abilities, problem-solving abilities, and other abilities of students.

\* The event was canceled in AY2020 due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. In AY2021, the event was held with online participation by overseas students. Acceptance of on-site participation by overseas students resumed from AY2022.
